PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING RELATIVE TO APPLICATION BY YANCEY COUNTY FOR FUNDING UNDER THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 1974, AS AMENDED

Notice is hereby given that
Yancey County will conduct a
public hearing on October 9,
2017 at 5:45 PM, or as soon
thereafter as the agenda will
allow, in the Courtroom at the
Yancey County Courthouse
relative to the intention of the
County to apply for FY 2017
CDBG funding under Title I of
the Housing and Community
Development Act.

Yancey County intends
to submit an application for a
grant of approximately \$900,00
in CDBG Infrastructure funds to
extend sewer service to the
new Blue Ridge Elementary
School (a consolidation of Bald
Creek, Bee Log, and Clearmont
Elementary schools) to be con-
structed beside the existing
Cane River Middle School.
The County proposes to install
approximately 7,000 linear feet
of new sewer line including a
pump station and manholes to
serve the two schools.

The following is a tentative
list of proposed activities and
an estimated budget. The final
application will be reviewed at
the public hearing.

Sewer Line Installation
Estimated Budget \$900,000

The proposed project will
provide benefits to students and
staff at the current Cane River
Middle School, Bald Creek
Elementary, Bee Log Element-
ary, and Clearmont Elementary
schools, at least 51% of whom
are low and moderate income
individuals based on surveys
performed by Yancey County.
No individuals will be displaced
nor will any require temporary
relocation assistance as a result
of the proposed project.

Citizens will be given the
opportunity to provide oral
and written comment on the
County's past and proposed use
of CDBG funds at the public
hearing. All interested citizens
are encouraged to attend.

complaints or comments con-
cerning the application process
that are submitted to the County
prior to or following the public
hearing will be responded to
within ten working days by
September 25, 2017. A copy of
the completed project applica-
tion will be available for public
review after November 1, 2017.

Office.
